#### RIO DE JANEIRO'S TOURIST GUIDE

### 1- Walk in Copacabana's beach



To get to know Copacabana and enjoy the famous view, a walk by the shore is a good option. To walk the hole length of the beach, it takes about one hour and a half. For those who want an option with a little more excitement, the area close to Copacabana's Fort has several locations to rent stand up paddle boards that cost about R\$55,00.

**How to get there**: Several bus lines pass by Atlântica Avenue and at smaller streets around the area. You can also take the subway, going to Cardeal Arcoverde, Siqueira Campos and Cantagalo stations.

**How much**: for free

Where: Atlântica Avenue, Copacabana

### 2- Sugar Loaf



One of the most known attractions of the city, it is situated in Urca. The cablecar leads to Urca's Hill and then to the Sugar Loaf. Each part of the way takes about 3 minutes.

**How to get there:** There aren't a lot of bus lines in Urca, but there is a lot of cabs available throughout the city.

## 3- Lapa



Lapa is a neighborhood known for it's bars, restaurants and concerts.

**How to get there:** there are a lot of bus lines going to Lapa from different areas of the city.

## 4- Mauá Square



Mauá Square is a great place to visit. There, you can also go to Museu do Amanhã and MAR – Rio's Museum of Art.

**How to get there:** Several bus lines go there.

5- São Cristóvão's open-air market



The Luiz Gonzaga Center of Northeastern's Traditions, also known as São Cristóvão's Open-Air Market, has a lot of restaurants, concerts and even karaoke.

**How to get there:** There are a lot of bus lines going to São Cristóvão. Taking a bus is also a nice way to know the neighborhood where, once, the Royal Family lived.

**How much:** for free on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. On Fridays, it is for free until 6pm. On Saturdays and Sundays, the tickets cost R\$3,00 or R\$5,00. When there are concerts, they go up to R\$10,00.

Where: São Cristóvão's Fields, no number, São Cristóvão

## 6- Arpoador



The Arpoador is a stone in Ipanema and it holds one the most beautiful views of the city. It is a great spot to see the most amazing sunsets. It is very easy to climb.

**How to get there:** To go to Ipanema, there are several buses to take. You can also take the subway and go to General Osório station.

How much: for free

Where: Arpoador's Beach, Ipanema

## 7- Lage Park



This park has a huge green area and a track that leads to the Corcovado. For those interested in art, is it possible to participate in an open class of the visual arts' school there. For more information about that, check the website: <a href="http://eavparquelage.rj.gov.br/">http://eavparquelage.rj.gov.br/</a>

**How to get there:** there are several bus lines that pass by the park. There is also a parking lot.

How much: for free

Where: Jardim Botânico Street, 414, Jardim Botânico

### 8- Christ the Redeemer



The most famous place in the city. Tickets can be bought online or in Riotur spots for the train ride, but you can also go by van. They leave from Lido's Square in Copacabana, Largo do Machado and Paineiras Road.

**How to get there:** by Riotur's train or by van. It's also possible to go on the track in Lage Park.

**How much:** R\$64,00 on high seasons, weekends and holidays and R\$52,00 on low season. Children from 6 to 11 years old and those with 60 years or more pay

### 9- Botanical garden



The Botanical Garden of Rio de Janeiro is one of the most beautiful and preserved areas of the city. It is open to visitation from Mondays to Sundays and it is possible to see a lot of plants and animals.

**How to get there:** There are a lot of bus lines that pass by the Garden.

Where: Jardim Botânico Street, 1008, Jardim Botânico

## 10- The worker's Samba



This is a well known event in the city and it happens on Mondays, Saturdays and Sundays at the Renascença Club. It's a music event where you can hear the greatest sambas of Brazil.

**How to get there:** there are bus lines that can get you to several streets around the Club.

**How much:** R\$20,00 (beverage and food charged separately)

Where: Renascença Club – Barão de São Francisco Street, 54, Andaraí

# 11- Ouvidor's Samba



This event happens once a month in the historical center of the city. It is a great option if you want to apreciate good music and the historical constructions of Rio.

**How to get there:** a lot of bus lines pass by the historical center.

How much: for free
